WHY OUR FIRST-GENERATION STUDENTS NEED OUR HELP

Nationally, more than one-third of college students are first in their family to attend college, and are more likely to represent a racial or ethnic minority group, according to the National Center for Education Statistics. On a local level, Fresno State reported that in the Fall of 2021, 66.2% of undergraduates enrolled were first-generation (first-gen) students.

First-gen college students face greater academic, professional, financial, and psychological challenges, and are less likely to take advantage of support services on campus, than their non-first-gen peers.

The studies give us good reason to support first-gen students:

- 89% of first-generation college students who come from low-income households leave college after six years without completing their degrees.
 Many first generation students leave college so they can work more hours to support themselves or their family, or because college is not economically sustainable for them.
- The median parental income for first-gen students in 2016 was \$41,000 compared with \$90,000 for continuing generation students, according to the Center for First-generation Student Success in Washington D.C.
- 61% of first-gen college students want to give back to their communities compared to 43% of their non-first-gen peers.

A NEW PROGRAM WITH CLEAR RESULTS

California Teaching Fellows Foundation is determined to improve the lives of first-generation college students—through graduation and career success—with dedicated support services and a new leadership program that was tested in the spring of 2022.

The purpose of the First-Gen College Student Leadership Program is to provide support and resources to Teaching Fellows who identify as first-generation college students. This program will help college students develop themselves personally, effectively navigate challenges, build career skills, gain self-efficacy and valuable resources, and further connect with their peers who have similar experiences.

Each participant will leave feeling empowered and confident, embracing their leadership role in their community and within their spheres of influence, while knowing that they are not alone.



IMPACT

A cohort of 60 students will participate in 9 months of:

TRAINING WORKSHOPS

Personal, professional and community leadership

DEVELOPMENT

Resource, networking and support system

GOAL SETTING

Career skills coaching and life coaching

NETWORKING

Engaging with each other and in the community

STRENGTHS

Ending in a culmination dinner event, having turned what may be viewed as a liability into an asset







A SNAPSHOT OF SPRING 2022 RESULTS



Students participated in a pre- and postprogram self-assessment. Out of 23 life competencies and conditions, the group improved in every single component. In 17 areas, gains were made by one entire level. Additionally, gains were reported by two levels in these two areas: "I have an understanding about the community resources available to me" and "I have addressed trauma, generalized anxiety, depression or similar conditions in my life."

With "very good" to "excellent" program satisfaction scores across the board in evaluations, the spring 2022 pilot program was a success. More importantly, it demonstrated the need for a program that gives first-gen college students a boost in school, career and life.

CTFF is a leading nonprofit organization that hires and trains more than 2,000 diverse college students in five Central Valley counties to work in low-income morning and afterschool programs. This group of future teachers, we call Teaching Fellows, are first-generation, low-income college students with a passion to serve K-12 students at their school sites with tutorial and enrichment programs running from 8 AM until 6 PM daily.

The first-gen leadership program is administered by our Dream Initiative team. The Dream Initiative offers free support services to advance the well-being of CTFF employees. If Teaching Fellows are to be effective role models and meet the social-emotional needs of youth, it starts with meeting their own needs first.

CTFF's CEO, Mike Snell, began to dream of how to support Teaching Fellow tutors with more than professional development in 2016. After reading the book, The Dream Manager by Matthew Kelly, he knew that Teaching Fellows have stories and struggles that keep them from succeeding in school, work and life. A subsequent survey of all 2,000 employees fortified his hunch—they needed financial, academic, career, and social-emotional support. With that input, he invested in designing a personal development solution, which was called the Dream Initiative.

At the heart of the Dream Initiative are Life Coaches. These qualified professionals elevate the support services by identifying the current needs of staff, which informs what resources are needed.
